COMMENTS

The present publication is based on the latest authorised editions newly collated with the autographs. Some peculiarities of the original notation have been retained. The fingering is the composer's. Obvious printing errors have been corrected without comments. Essencial variant readings are listed in the notes below. Editor's emendations are held to a minimum and enclosed in square brackets.

Scherzo No. 1. Autograph is not available. Only the cover of a printed copy survives bearing the composer's note: "Begun 10 March — completed 14 March 1856. Dedicated to Maria Ivanovna Baggovut". The first edition: F. Stellovsky (St. Petersburg), No. 4 in the PCA series; the publication may be referred to 1863 (on account of an advertisement in the *Yakor (Anchor)* magazine, 1863, 31 August, No. 26, p. 512).

In 1886 K. Gutheil purchased Stellovsky's firm and without further delay set about reprinting works by Balakirev which had been published in the PCA series. For this new edition Balakirev made a number of emendations in one of the printed copies of the Stellovsky publication (RNB, 41/1/178) and put in three handwritten inserts containing 10 to 15 bars each. The present publication follows Gutheil's edition.

Polka. Written not later than 1857 (was entered by the composer in the list of his works compiled in 1857). The autograph is not available, save for the first page, containing 31 bars, with its title inscribed in blue pencil by V. V. Stasov (RNB,41/1/145). The first edition: V. Denotkin (St. Petersburg); the publication can be referred to — the earliest — 1859 (on account of the publisher's letter of October 22, 1859, to Balakirev, putting forth a proposal to print his "lovely polka"). Subsequent editions: No. 3 in the PCA series, 1861; K. Gutheil (Moscow), not earlier than 1886.

The present publication follows Gutheil's edition. Slurs and accent markings are missing in all the editions; added by the Editor on the evidence of the existing autograph page.

Mazurka No. 2. The autograph is not available, the date is uncertain. First published by F. Stellovsky in a supplement to

the magazine *Russky Mir (The Russian World)*, 1861, No. 50. The piece being printed at Gutheil's (not earlier than 1886), Balakirev transposed the enclosing sections of the mazurka from B minor into C sharp minor. The present publication follows the Gutheil's edition.

The Skylark. A concert transcription of a M. I. Glinka romance written by him in 1840. The autograph is not available. The first edition: F. Stellovsky (St. Petersburg), 1864; the title in French: *L'alouette*. Subsequent editions: B. Schott (Mainz), 1871, 1890. With a forthcoming publication of the piece at Gutheil's in view (Moscow, not earlier than 1886), Balakirev entered some corrections in one of the printed copies of the 1871 edition (RNB, 41/1/283).

The transcription became wide-spread in Russia and abroad. It is noteworthy that the piece was performed by Balakirev in the Glinka recital at the Nobility Assembly Hall (St. Petersburg, December 12, 1882) arranged to facilitate the errection of a monument to M. I. Glinka in the town of Smolensk. The present publication follows Gutheil's edition.

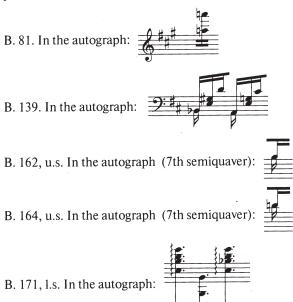
In a copy of the Gutheil' edition, once being in possession of Balakirev's disciple B. L. Zhilinsky, S. M. Lyapunov wrote down the following authentic version of the right hand part (b. 41):

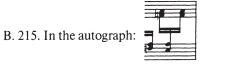


Islamey. Oriental fantasy. The autograph (RNB, 41/1/145) is dated: "1869, 13 Sept. Begun 9 August in Moscow. Completed 13/ix in Petersburg." There also exists an authorized copy with a variant textural setting of the fantasy, later rejected by the composer (GMMK, 39/2). The first edition: P. Jurgenson (Moscow), 1870; in accordance with Balakirev's desire it was printed "with the Russian terms and a Russian title".

A Hamburg based publisher D. Rahter was "amazed and literally astounded" by the piece. In 1888 he put it out with the Italian markings and a subtitle in French, and in 1902 he issued a de luxe edition, designed in the Oriental style.

The edition of the fantasy brought out by Jurgenson in 1909 was — at Balakirev's request — based on Rahter's publication and bore a supplement on its covering page: "A new edition, revised and corrected by the composer." The present publication follows this edition.

In his series of articles "25 Years of Russian Art" V. Stasov wrote about *Islamey*: "This piece is the best, the most perfect piano composition of our Russian school and, besides, one of the most prominent creations in the domain of the piano music as a whole. The greatest of all the concert piano players Liszt always highly appreciated this work. It never left his instrument; all of his pupils had to play it".

In the Garden. Idyll-study. The autograph (GMMK, 39/4) is dated: "15 November 1884". The first edition: P. Jurgenson (Moscow), 1885; the title in Russian and in French: *Au jardin*. The present publication follows this edition which is fully in accordance with the autograph.

The first page bears composer's note in French: "Les notes, dans la partie de la main gauche, marquées de la lettre d, doivent etre exécutées par la main droite. L'emploi des pedales est réservé au gout de l'exécutant." ("The notes in the part for the left hand which are marked with the letter d must be played with the right hand. The use of pedal is a matter of the performer's taste.")

Mazurka No. 4. Written ca 1884-1885 (dated on account of Balakirev's letter of March 12, 1884, to S. Kruglikov). The autograph: RNB, 41/1/63. The first edition: P. Jurgenson (Moscow), 1886. The present publication follows this edition which is fully in accordance with the autograph.

Nocturne No. 1. The autograph (RNB, 41/1/245) is dated: "18/X 1898." The first edition: K. Gutheil (Moscow), 1898. The present publication follows this edition.
