- RST = right sides of fabric together



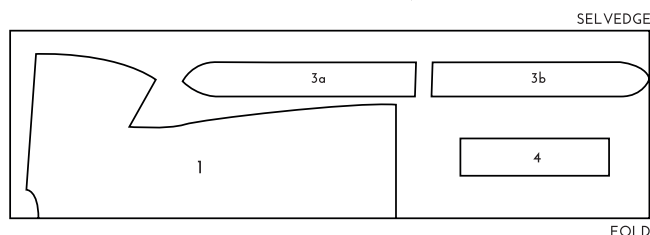
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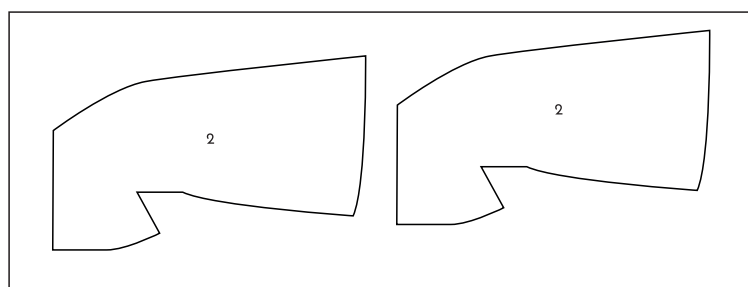

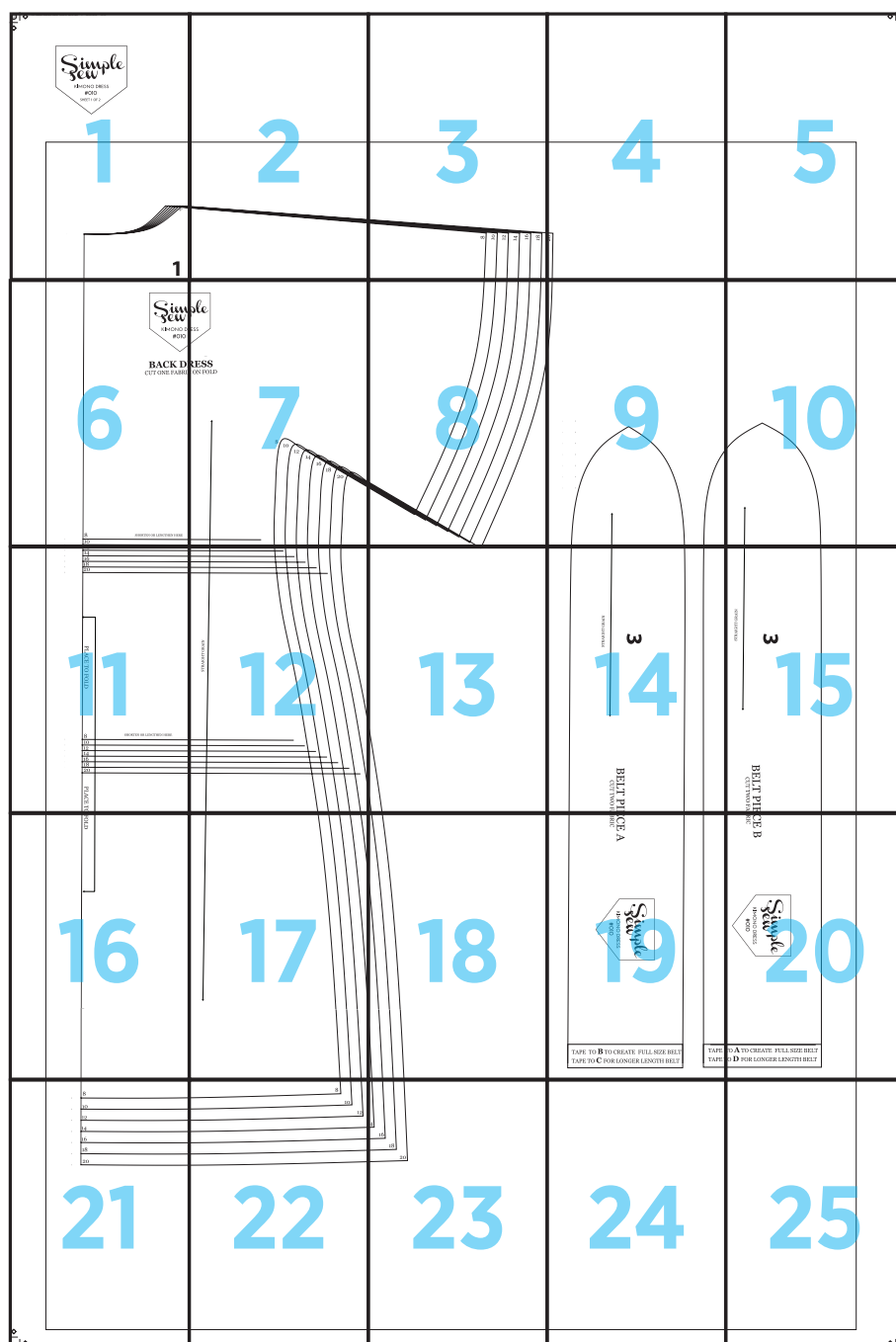
GENERAL PREPARATION

It is really important to launder your fabric (according to the manufacturer's instructions) before you begin - this allows for shrinkage.

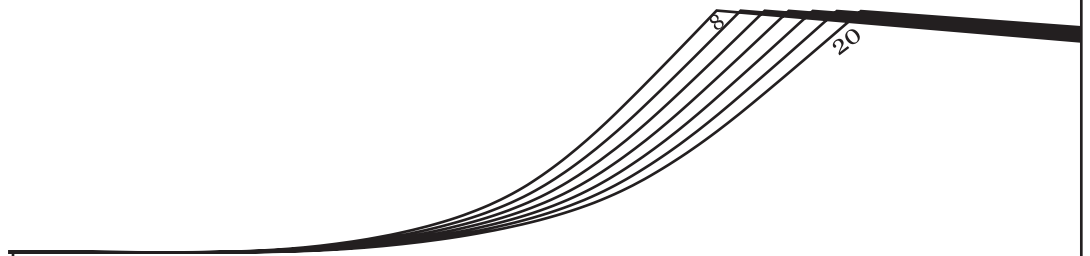
