Test 1

Narrator: Listen and colour.

One

A: *Look at the pencil.*

B: *The pencil? Oh, yes.*

A: *Colour the pencil red.*

B: *OK. The pencil is red.*

Two

A: *Now, look at the schoolbag.*

B: *Sorry?*

A: *The schoolbag. Colour it green.*

B: *The schoolbag? Green?*

A: *Yes.*

Three

A: *Now, look at the rubber.*

B: *OK. What colour is the rubber?*

A: *Orange.*

B: *Orange?*

A: *Yes. Colour the rubber orange.*

B: *OK.*

Four

A: *Now, look at the book.*

B: *Pardon?*

A: *The book. Colour the book blue.*

B: *Blue?*

A: *Yes. Colour the book blue.*

Five

A: *Now, look at the pencil case.*

B: *OK. What colour is the pencil case?*

A: *The pencil case is pink.*

B: *Pink?*

A: *Yes, that's right!*

Test 2

Narrator: Look at the picture. Listen and look. There is one example.

Girl: *This is a picture of my family. Can you see my grandma? Her name is Martha.*

Narrator: Can you see the circle? Now you listen and circle.

Boy: *Is that your grandpa?*

Girl: *Yes. His name is Harry.*

Boy: *Henry?*

Girl: *No, my grandpa's name is Harry.*

Boy: *And is that your dad?*

Girl: *Yes. His name is Tom.*

Boy: *His name is Tony?*

Girl: *No! My dad's name is Tom!*

Boy: *What's your mum's name?*

Girl: *My mum's name is Julia.*

Boy: *Julia?*

Girl: *Yes! And that's my brother, Sam.*

Boy: *Your brother, Sam?*

Girl: *Yes! And look at my baby sister! Isn't she cute?*

Boy: *Yes, she is! What's her name?*

Girl: *Her name's Sally!*

Boy: *Sue?*

Girl: *No! Her name is Sally.*

Test 3

Narrator: Look at the picture. Listen and look. There is one example.

Woman: *Do you like chicken, Steve?*

Steve: *Chicken? Yuk! I don't like chicken!*

Narrator: Can you see the cross? Now you listen and put a tick or a cross.

Woman: *How about pizza?*

Steve: *Oh, yes! I love pizza!*

Woman: *Popcorn? Do you like popcorn?*

Steve: *Popcorn! Yuk! I don't like popcorn!*

Three

Woman: *What about burgers?*

Steve: *Oh, yes! I love burgers!*

Four

Woman: *Lemonade? Do you like lemonade?*

Steve: *No, I don't! Yuk! I don't like lemonade!*

Five

Woman: *Do you like eggs?*

Steve: *Yes, I do! I really love eggs!*

Test 4

Narrator: Whose toys are they? Listen and match. There is one example.

Man: *Hi, Kelly! What's this?*

Kelly: *Oh, hello! It's my new tea set! Do you like it?*

Man: *Yes, it's very nice, Kelly!*

Narrator: Can you see the letter A? Now you listen and match.

One

Nick: *Look! Do you like my new aeroplane?*

Woman: *Oh, yes, Nick!*

Nick: *It can fly, too!*

Woman: *Wow! Your aeroplane is really nice, Nick!*

Two

Man: *Hi, Julie! What's this? A doll?*

Julie: *No, it isn't a doll, it's a musical box! Do you like it?*

Man: *Yes, it's a very nice musical box, Julie.*

Three

Woman: *Hi, Brian! Is that a rocking horse?*

Brian: *Yes, it is!*

Woman: *Wow! Let me see!*

Brian: *Do you like it? It's my favourite toy!*

Woman: *Your rocking horse is very nice, Brian!*

Four

Man: *Hello, Lynda! Whose is this elephant?*

Lynda: *It's my elephant! Do you like it?*

Man: *Oh, yes! Your elephant is very funny, Lynda!*

Test 5

Narrator: Look at the pictures. Now listen and look. There is one example.

Boy: *Look at my sheep! It hasn't got a thin body. It's got a fat body and thin legs.*

Narrator: Can you see the circle? Now you listen choose A or B.

Girl: *Look at my dog! It's got a long tail. It hasn't got a short tail. It's very funny!*

Two

Boy: *Look at my bird! It hasn't got a big head. It's got a very small head.*

Three

Girl: *Look at my rabbit! It's got very big ears. It's very cute!*

Four

Boy: *Look at my mouse! It's got a fat body and a long tail.*

Five

Girl: *Look at my frog! It hasn't got small eyes. It's got very big eyes.*

Test 6

Where's Betty?

Girl: *Is Betty sleeping?*

Boy: *No, she's reading.*

Girl: *Is she reading in her bedroom?*

Boy: *No, she isn't. She's reading in the living room.*

Narrator: Can you see the tick? Now you listen and tick the box.

Narrator: 1 *Where's the cat?*

Girl: *Where's my cat? I can't find her.*

Boy: *Is she on the table?*

Girl: *No, she isn't. Is she on the bed?*

Boy: *No, but look! There she is! She's in the cupboard!*

Narrator: 2 *Which boy is Tony?*

Boy: *Is Tony in the garden?*

Girl: *No, he isn't. He's in his bedroom.*

Boy: *Is he listening to music?*

Girl: *No, he's playing computer games.*

Narrator: 3 *Where are the glasses?*

Girl: *Are the glasses on the shelf?*

Boy: *No, they aren't.*

Girl: *Are they in the cupboard?*

Boy: *No, they're on the table.*

Narrator: 4 *What's in the living room?*

Boy: *Is there a mirror in your living room?*

Girl: *No, there isn't.*

Boy: *Is there a lamp?*

Girl: *No, but there's a new sofa.*

Test 7

Man: *Can you see Tanya?*

Boy: *Tanya? Oh, yes! She's playing basketball.*

Narrator: Can you see the line? Now, you listen and draw lines.

Man: *Look! That's Mick over there!*

Boy: *What's he doing?*

Man: *He's riding a bike.*

Boy: *Where's Greg?*

Man: *Greg? That's Greg! He's climbing a tree!*

Boy: *And where's Amy?*

Man: *Can you see her? She's making a sandcastle!*

Boy: *What's she wearing?*

Man: *She's wearing a mac!*

Boy: *Oh, yes. That's Amy!*

Man: *Is Rob running?*

Boy: *No, that's not Rob. Rob's eating a hot dog!*

Man: *Oh, yes! I can see him!*

Test 8
