CAROLINE PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Caroline is a close-fitting dress with a slight flare at the bottom. The fit of the dress is achieved by the bias cut. The front features bust darts and a center seam. The back features shoulder and waist darts as well as a center seam. The round neckline has a keyhole opening and a button and button loop closure at the back. The dress has long, set-in, close-fitting sleeves that are slightly flared at the bottom. Caroline is above-ankle length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this dress, choose dress-weight fabrics with the following properties:

- medium weight, with good drape, soft, non-stretch or with very little stretch, opaque
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (silk), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (silk + polyester, etc.), and synthetics (polyester)
- the following fabrics are recommended: satin, dress-weight viscose, stretch crepe, natural silk, artificial silk

Attention! We do not recommend stretchy (with elastane) and lightweight sheer fabrics (chiffon, organza, stretch lace).

The dress in the photo is made of artificial silk. The fabric is medium weight, soft, non-stretch and with good drape. The fiber content is 100% polyester.

2. Lightweight woven interfacing,
140 cm (55") wide, for all heights:

Size	34-42	44-52
Meters	0.15	0.2
Yards	1/8	1/4

IMPORTANT! When purchasing fabric, please account for shrinkage and buy 5% more than required.

3. One button, 1 cm (3/8") in diameter

4. Matching thread — 5 spools (1 spool for the sewing machine + 4 spools for the overlocker)

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for construction
- overlocker for finishing raw edges. This may be replaced with a stretch overlock stitch or a zigzag stitch on the sewing machine (overlock or zigzag stitch width 2–3 mm, stitch length 2.5 mm)
- stitch-in-the-ditch foot for the sewing machine (optional)

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front — cut 2
- back — cut 2
- sleeve — cut 2
- front neck facing — cut 1
- back neck facing — cut 2
- rouleau loop — cut 1

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

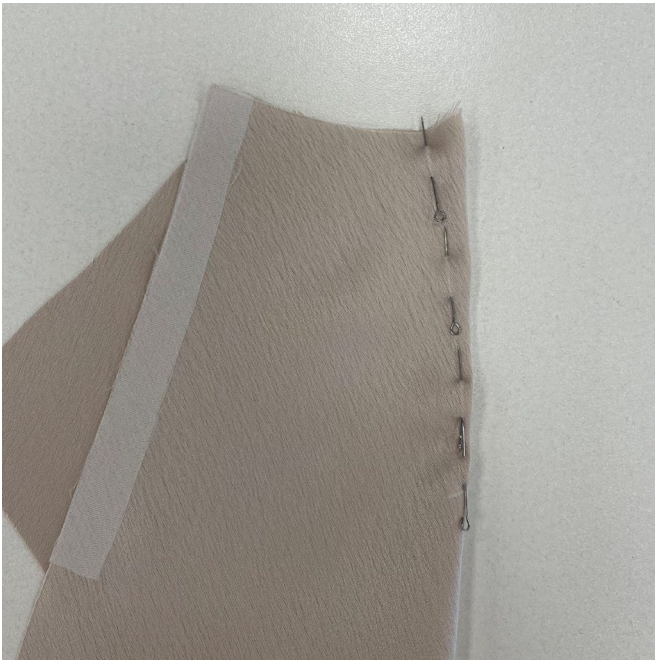
2. From interfacing:

- front neck facing — cut 1
- back neck facing — cut 2

Additionally, cut the following pieces from interfacing:

- two strips, 1.3 cm (1/2") wide (length according to the pattern), to interface the slit section of the center seam allowances on the back pieces
- two strips, 1.3 cm (1/2") wide (length according to the pattern), to interface the shoulder seam allowances on the front pieces

The interfacing strips should be cut on the straight grain (parallel to the selvedge).



Match the shoulder and waist dart legs on the wrong side of the back pieces and pin.



Machine-stitch the shoulder darts on the back pieces. Backstitch at the shoulder edge.

Machine-stitch the waist darts on the back pieces without backstitching.

Tie the thread tails at the dart point into a knot and hide them inside the dart bulk using a needle.



Press the darts flat.
