RILEY PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Riley is a pair of tapered, semi-fitted kids pants. The grown-on waistband has elastic threaded through it. There are cuffs at the bottom of the pants.

2. Additional fabric (ribbing), 120 cm (47 1/4") wide, for all sizes and all heights - 0.11 m (1/8 yd).

IMPORTANT! When purchasing fabric, please account for shrinkage and buy 5% more than required.

3. Elastic, 4 cm (1 5/8") wide, 50–75 cm (19 5/8–29 1/2") long depending on the size and height. The exact elastic length can be found on the pattern pieces.

4. Matching thread - 5 spools (1 spool for the sewing machine and 4 spools for the overlocker).

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT

- sewing machine for constructing the cuffs
- overlocker for construction and for finishing raw edges. It may be replaced with a stretch overlock stitch or a zigzag stitch on the sewing machine (overlock or zigzag stitch width 2–3 mm, stitch length 2.5 mm)
- bodkin for threading elastic through a channel (may be replaced with a safety pin).

IMPORTANT! When sewing knit fabrics, it's recommended to use specialty needles for knits (such as *STRETCH*, *SUPER STRETCH*, *JERSEY*, etc.). These are ballpoint needles with a rounded tip which allows the needle to pass in between the loops instead of piercing the threads.

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- front leg – cut 2
- back leg – cut 2.

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.

2. From additional fabric:

- cuff – cut 2.

SEAM ALLOWANCES

All pattern pieces include a 1 cm (3/8") seam allowance.

Take this into account when laying out pattern pieces on the fabric.



Join the elastic ends. To do so, overlap the ends of the elastic and machine-stitch to secure them using a triple stitch setting.

Divide the elastic in four equal parts and mark these four reference notches using tailor's chalk or a pencil.



Mark the seam allowance along the top edge of the pants, as shown in the photo.



Place the elastic to the wrong side of the pants. Match the notches on the waistband with the seams on the garment.
