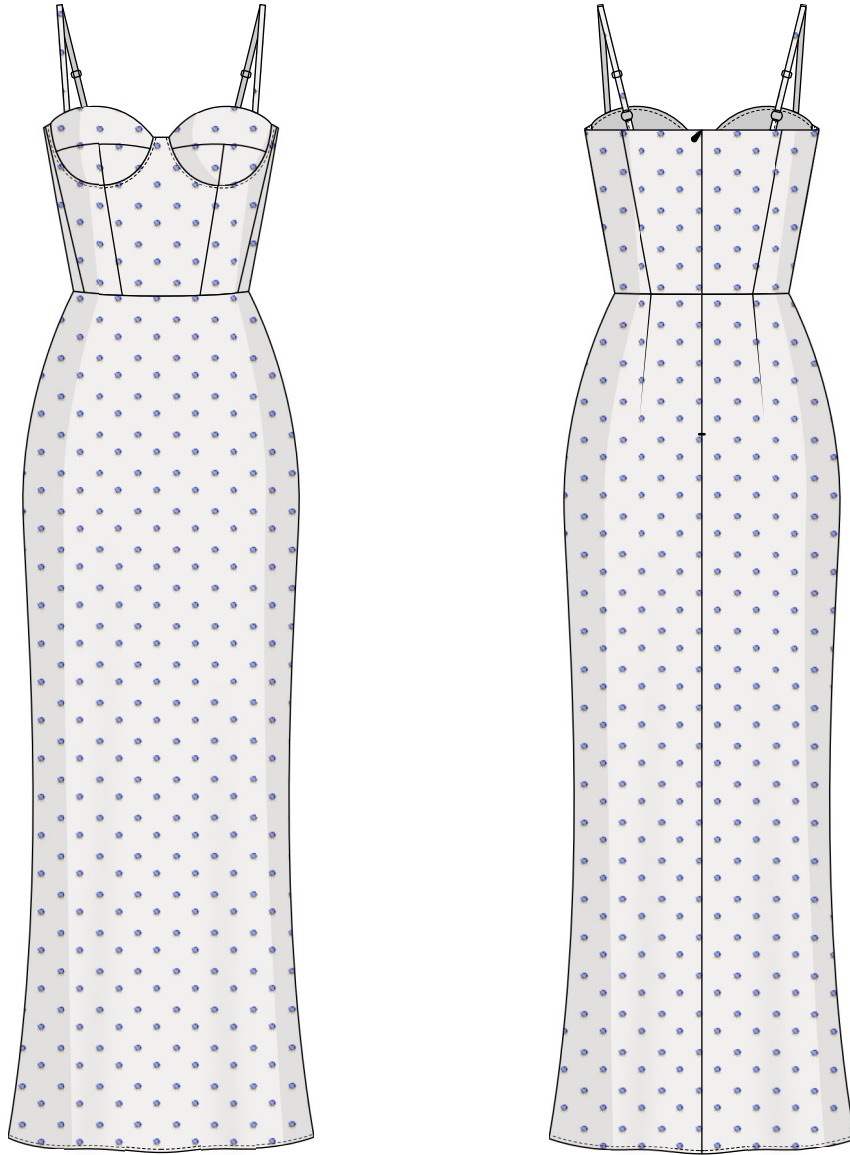

AGNESSA PATTERN DESCRIPTION

Agnessa is a close-fitting dress with a waist seam and adjustable spaghetti straps. This lingerie-inspired corset dress features bust cups made of bra foam. The silhouette is shaped with front and back princess seams. The skirt is cut on the bias. The dress is finished with a free-hanging lining and fastens with an invisible zipper in the center back seam. Agnessa is above-ankle length.

SUGGESTED FABRIC

To sew this dress, choose dress-weight fabrics with the following properties:

- medium weight, pliable, soft, non-stretch
- the fiber content can include natural fibers (silk), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (silk + polyester, silk + viscose) and synthetics (polyester)
- the following fabrics are recommended: satin, crepe, crepe de chine, silk.

For the lining, we recommend lining fabrics made of natural fibers (silk), artificial fibers (viscose), blends (viscose + polyester) and synthetics (polyester).

The dress in the photo is made of silk. The fabric is medium weight, pliable, soft, and non-stretch. The fiber content is 100% silk. The fabric weight is 50 g/m².

The lining is 100% silk. The fabric weight is 50 g/m².

PATTERN PIECES LIST

1. From main fabric:

- center front bodice* — cut 1 on fold
- mid front bodice* — cut 2
- side front bodice* — cut 2
- center back bodice* — cut 2
- side back bodice* — cut 2
- center cup* — cut 2
- side cup* — cut 2
- top cup* — cut 2
- front skirt — cut 1
- back skirt — cut 2
- strap + strap ring holder — cut 2.

Important! Interface (block fuse) a big enough piece of the main fabric prior to cutting the pieces marked with an asterisk (*). Interface in two steps: first, the grainline of the interfacing should follow the grainline of the main fabric, and then interface the main fabric following the crosswise grain.

2. From lining fabric:

- center front bodice — cut 1 on fold
- mid front bodice — cut 2
- side front bodice — cut 2
- center back bodice — cut 2
- side back bodice — cut 2
- center cup lining — cut 2
- side cup lining — cut 2
- top cup lining — cut 2
- front skirt — cut 1
- back skirt — cut 2.

3. From interfacing:

- center front bodice — cut 2 on fold
- mid front bodice — cut 4
- side front bodice — cut 4
- center back bodice — cut 4
- side back bodice — cut 4
- center cup — cut 4
- side cup — cut 4
- top cup — cut 4.

Additionally, cut two interfacing strips, 2 cm (3/4") wide, to reinforce the zipper section of the center seam allowances on the back skirt pieces. The interfacing strips should be cut on the cross grain (perpendicular to the selvedge).

4. From bra foam:

- center cup — cut 2
- side cup — cut 2
- top cup — cut 2.

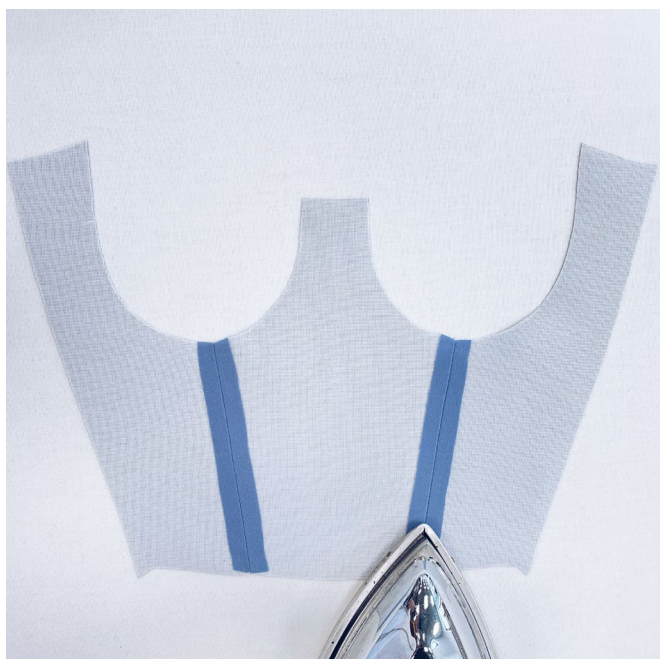
The foam cup pieces are the last to be cut. Before cutting them, trim:

- the bottom seam allowance off the top cup pattern piece
- the top and side seam allowances off the center cup and side cup pattern pieces.

IMPORTANT! Don't forget to transfer all pattern markings and notches onto the fabric.



Press the seams flat.



Press the seam allowances open.



Place the assembled front and side front bodice pieces right sides together, align the edges, match the notches and pin. Machine-stitch, backstitching at the beginning and end of the seams.
